Call for Nominations

Nominations due Thursday, September 1, 2022

WiSE is now accepting nominations for our WiSE Women of Color in STEM Career Preparation Program (also called WWoCS-CPP). Nominations may be submitted by faculty or students who wish to self-nominate. Please note a limited number of applicants will be accepted.

Eligibility:

- Sophomore and junior undergraduates in STEM who self-identify as a woman and a person of color or
- Sophomore and junior undergraduates in STEM (of any sex, gender, or race) who can demonstrate a commitment to supporting and advancing the inclusion of women of color in STEM
- All applicants must major in a degree program of one of the 19 STEM departments (the list of departments can be found on the WiSE website [here](#))

Key elements of the program:

- Small stipend and certificate award for a one-year commitment
- Monthly activities and resources focusing on professional skills, networking, and community building
- Opportunity to develop and receive feedback on an early portfolio package, including a resume, personal statement, and career plan

Nominations should include:

- Student's name and contact information
- Discipline and primary department
- Year in degree program
- A brief personal statement from the student (~250 words), which addresses (1) why the student would like to participate in WWoCS-CPP; and (2) their commitment to and experience facilitating the inclusion of women of color in STEM
- Nominator's role (advisor, mentor) and contact information; for self-nominations, provide the contact info of your primary academic or research advisor
- Brief statement about the student's coursework, research, and strengths
- Comment on the availability of the student to participate in at least five activities
- Indicate whether the student is remote or on campus
